Grade level: first grade **Subject:** Social Studies

Materials needed: "Pigeon Needs a Bath" book, two hula hoops for each group, need signs, want signs, a set of picture cards for each group, one set magnetic picture cards for teacher

Standards: 1.3.1 Differentiate between wants and needs

Objectives: students will be able to convey the difference between wants and needs. Students will visually represent what needs and wants are. Students will discuss in small and large group about needs and wants.

Learning activities:

- Teacher will have story time and read "Pigeon Needs a Bath"
- Teacher and students will discuss as a group what the book was about and needs vs wants
- Teacher will break the class up into groups
- Each group will get two hoops one for needs and one for wants
- Teacher will hand out picture cards and give directions to look at the pictures on each card and put them into the correct hoop
- After all groups are finished teacher will walk around to compare hoops form each group
- Teacher will draw her own hoops on the board and use magnetic cards to review each picture with the class and put in the correct hoop
- Teacher and students will discuss each picture and explain what it is a want or a need
- Students will watch a short video to recap and wrap up lesson
