1. Create a Welcoming Environment:

Make your preschool room unique, it is ok to get creative with the different areas within your classroom. When children enter your classroom they should feel intrigued and excited to utilize what they see. There should be areas for large group, small group, and individual time. your classroom should have multiple areas to display their work and progress, there needs to be art, reading, experimenting, and dramatic play areas. The environment should be functional, organized, and inviting.

2. Hold High Expectation:

After children know what is expected of them they need to be held to their responsibility of being a student. Preschool is about learning how to act in social situations and how they can be successful in school. Children thrive with structure; when they are ready for preschool they are ready to have some responsibility. As teachers we are here to redirect them and remind them why they are here and how we act here, students should leave Preschool knowing what it means to be a students and how enjoyable school can be.

3. Use Hands On Visual Teaching:

Teachers, do not be afraid to make a mess and dig deep into their interests. Teaching does not always mean talking about the material, although that is a big part of it. We need to be teaching by doing. Applying the knowledge to real life situations is the best way to create independent learners. Visual hands on learning makes for optimistic children who believe they are capable of more.

4. Keep Track of Learning:

Teachers need to document each students growth and progress throughout the year. We will hold more than one parent teacher meeting and will keep parents posted as their children meet major milestones. As educators we need to always motivate and celebrate with our students. Children will view education as exciting and important if that is how we teach it.

5. Meet Their Needs:

This profession is more than a job. We are developing the future. We must always be finding the need and meeting the need. We need to do what it takes to better the learning and lives of our students. teachers will find and meet all of their students needs, educational and beyond.

Assessment

Teachers:
